Charleston-Works is a work readiness training and internship program for young adults (ages 18 to 30 at time of enrollment) so they can gain the personal and pre-employment skills needed to get a job in targeted sectors of the local economy. The program also includes certified skills training, such as Certified Nursing Assistant, Phlebotomy Technician, Hospitality Clerk so that the participant can be ready to be employed a high demand job after successfully completing the work readiness training, certified job skills training, and internship components.

Charleston-Works is considering offering a miner certification program at the Schoenbaum Family Enrichment Center. We are seeking input from the community to determine interest and feasibility. West Virginia is the national leader in underground mining production, accounting for nearly 50% of all American coal exports. Currently, the average annual salary for a West Virginia coal miner is \$62,700.00. Many job sites in this industry are not on the bus line.

This program would be 11 weeks in length and participants would receive certifications in underground mining, surface mining, OSHA 10, OSHA 30, CPR, AED, and First Aid.
